There is a question in regard to whether a person has a disability but no further information. Trends and patterns are monitored, however with a very low turnover the data gathered is a small sample.

The Pupil Premium Progress 8 Gap (Summerhill PP students compared the national average of all students) is -0.27. However, when we compare Summerhill PP students to national PP students we see strong progress: +0.13

SEN Support and EHC Plan students at Summerhill make stronger Progress 8 than the national average of all students. SEN Support +0.13, EHC Plan +0.20
